CAREERS IN PSYCHOLOGY: Some people who study psychology go on to develop a career working as a psychologist. There are a number of different careers in psychology. Case studies cannot give definitive answers, but they can provide useful information. You will look at the case of Genie. This is a tragic case of a child that was kept in severely deprived conditions for more than a decade. The case raises issues relating to ‘critical periods’ – the theory that there are crucial periods in our development during which we must get the appropriate experiences in order to develop particular abilities. For example, if a person does not experience love and affection during their first five years of life, will they be able to form attachments to other people? If they do not get exposed to language, will they ever be able to learn to use language proficiently?</p> <p>Genie’s tragic case enabled psychologists to explore these questions.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Video: Genie https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=VjZolHCrC8E • Case studies of privation – read case studies and answer questions 	<p>INTRODUCTION TO PSYCHOLOGY – GOING DEEPER</p> <p>The reading for this is quite challenging, but will enable you to develop your understanding of what psychology is and how psychologists approach the study and explanation of behaviour.
