I am currently in Year 11 and was lucky enough to secure a place on the Poetry Live trip to London last week to enhance my studies for GCSE English Literature. I was able to hear directly from the poets about their work as they added a powerful personal insight. Throughout the day, not only was I provided with a new, insightful outlook on the works I had studied, but also a newfound appreciation for the hauntingly beautiful art of poetry. I felt inspired by the wonder and passion with which the poets spoke as they exhibited countless perspectives on a plethora of topics; ranging from relationships to identity to even slightly more controversial issues such as social conflict.

My personal highlight of the trip was hearing Simon Armitage recite his piece 'Mother Any Distance' and Carol Ann Duffy perform 'Valentine' - I remember studying these poems in Year 7 where my interest in poetry first came about. Alongside hearing live poetry, an Unseen Poetry session was also provided where I was given useful advice on how to confidently approach this section of my exams. 

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
