Include the following information: Key dates, composers, musical events, and world events Fingerprints of the musical style – key stylistic features, context (why was the music composed? What influenced the composer? What was the music <i>in response</i> to? What is it used for?). For each period, pick at least one work which you feel is a good representative of the typical features. Use the Petrucci Music Library. Spotify, YouTube, or any other relevant resource. Classical period - Haydn, Mozart, and Beethoven only. Romantic period - focus on Rachmaninov, Liszt, Richard Strauss, and Tchaikovsky.
