## **From Medway Roots to Marketing Success: Emma Williams (Careers Advisor) Inspires the Next Generation**

Growing up in Medway, Emma Williams has built a career shaped by aspiration, community spirit, and a determination to make a difference. A former pupil of Rochester Girls' School and Featherby Primary School, Emma's journey reflects both her local pride and her drive to explore opportunities beyond the classroom before bringing her experience full circle back to the community where it all began.

At school, Emma pursued A-levels in Government and Politics, English Literature and Business, alongside GCSEs including History. Outside the classroom, she developed a passion for sport, particularly running and netball. Her dedication saw her run for Medway Athletic Club and represent Kent, achievements that instilled resilience and discipline she still carries today. Running remains an important part of her life, and her continued connection to local athletics highlights the enduring friendships she built growing up. In fact, one of her former training partners now coaches a current RMGS student at the same club something Emma describes as a powerful reminder of how communities come full circle.

Emma went on to study Business Studies at Staffordshire University, a course that included a valuable year in industry. During this time, she worked with the British Tourist Authority in London, gaining first-hand experience in a professional environment and laying the groundwork for her future career.

After graduating, Emma "fell into" marketing a field in which she would go on to build extensive experience. Over time, she began to consider launching her own business, a goal she developed over several years through networking and freelance work with major organisations. Motivated by a desire to avoid future regrets, Emma took the leap and established her own marketing business. Today, Emma specialises in supporting small to medium-sized businesses, helping them grow through strategic marketing and strong professional networks. She particularly enjoys the collaborative nature of her work and the opportunity to connect with others. Her involvement in organising careers fairs has also reignited her passion for working with young people.

While running a business brings rewards, Emma is honest about the challenges. "It can feel isolating at times," she explains, noting that the boundaries between work and personal life can blur. "But when you genuinely enjoy what you do, it changes how you experience those challenges."

Emma is also committed to guiding the next generation. She encourages young people interested in starting a business to research thoroughly, build connections and gain relevant experience. "Know your product, know your service and understand your audience," she advises. "Speak to people who have real experience of running a business, so you fully understand what's involved."

Now working in careers guidance, Emma finds her role deeply fulfilling. She values the opportunity to work directly with students, helping them explore their options and make informed decisions about their futures. "It's about giving young people the space to think about what they really want," she says. "When they see the possibilities available to them, it brings a real sense of purpose to their learning."

For Emma, one of the most rewarding aspects of her work is seeing students chase and achieve their goals—whether that is securing a college course, a university place, or an apprenticeship. She is also passionate about challenging stereotypes and ensuring that every student feels informed and supported as they take their next steps.

From Medway student to business owner and careers advocate, Emma Williams' journey is a testament to the power of perseverance, community and believing in your own potential.

Mix easier topics with harder ones.  
A visible plan can reduce overwhelm.
- 3** Good strategies:  
Past paper questions  
Flashcards  
Retrieval practice  
Teaching someone else  
Quick quizzes
- 4** During Exam Days  
Keep mornings calm and practical:  
Check equipment the night before  
Make sure they eat breakfast  
Leave in good time
- 5** Your role is not to be the expert in every subject. It is to be the steady, calm person who helps them stay organised, confident and healthy during a stressful period.

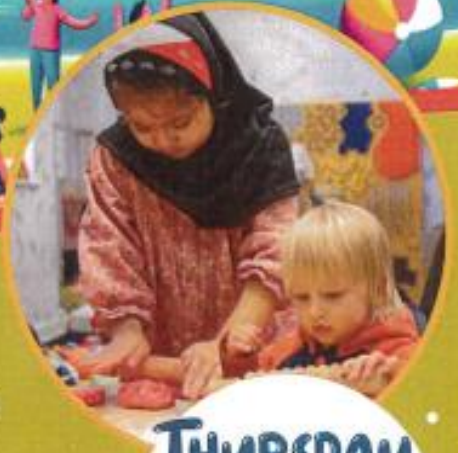

The day began with a fascinating guided tour of the United Nations, where students gained a real insight into global diplomacy and international cooperation.

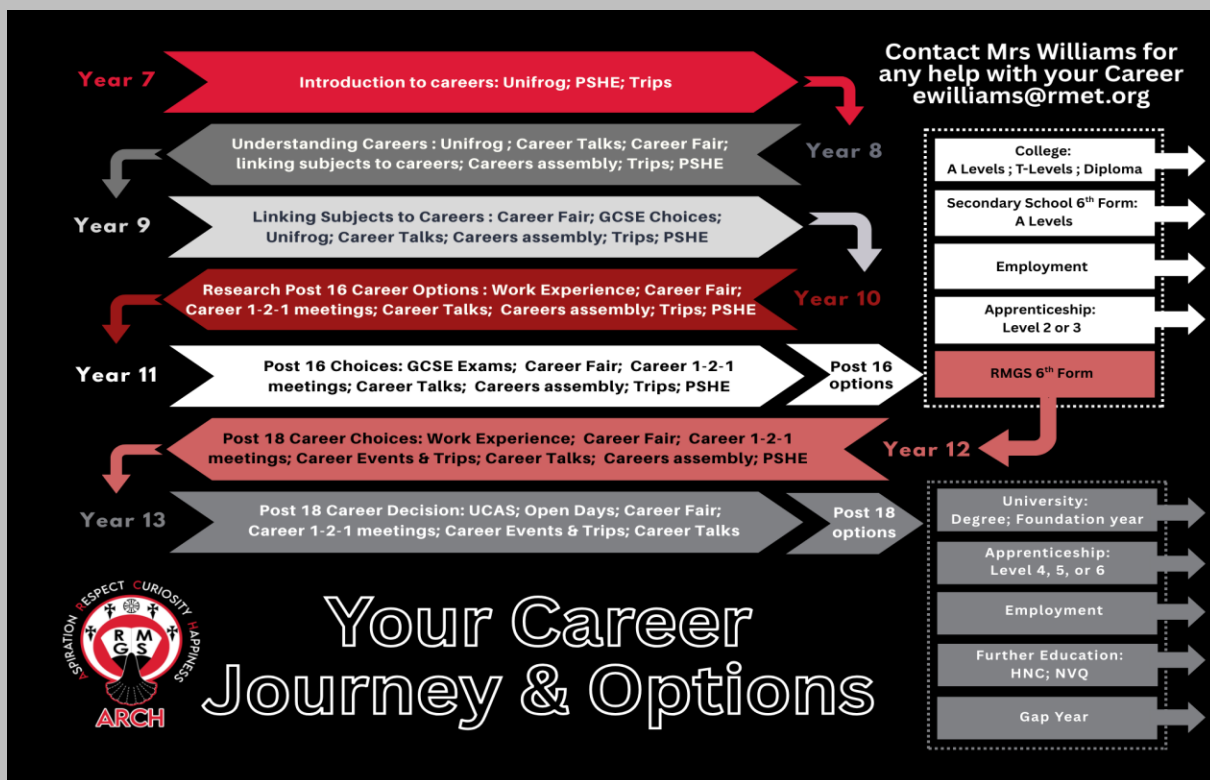

All Year 7 and 8 Parents/Guardians have now received an email detailing the roll out of our online Careers Platform Unifrog.

Unifrog is an online platform that supports secondary schools to deliver their statutory duty to provide students aged 4 to 18 with impartial and independent guidance on the full range of post-school career options. It helps students from Year 7 start to explore interests, subjects, pathways early so that they have a deeper awareness and understanding of all the post-school opportunities available.

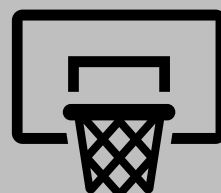
