Year 10/12 French and Art trip to Paris

Our recent trip to Paris with our Year 10 and Year 12 students was a real success, and I could not be prouder of how well they conducted themselves throughout. Despite cold, rainy weather and some very sore legs after climbing the steps of the Eiffel Tower, all students embraced the experience with enthusiasm and positivity. A special mention goes to Olivia, who bravely overcame a fear of heights to reach the first floor, a fantastic personal achievement. Many students fully immersed themselves in speaking French, with some even taking every opportunity to practise in real situations: Oscar, George and Arlo, for example, impressed us by confidently trying out their French slang during a game of pool with a hotel guest (arguably the best way to learn!). Others showed great enthusiasm when it came to French food: Alfred, in particular, pleasantly surprised me with his adventurous choices.

Some students also developed a rather *creative approach* to timekeeping while exploring Paris (George, Leo, Scarlett and Poppy, you know who you are! 😊), though, to their credit, they showed noticeable improvement as the trip progressed. Others made the most of the hotel facilities in a very organised way, thoughtfully stocking up at the vending machine before our 10pm curfew. However, the aftermath of these culinary plans was perhaps less impressive, as evidenced by the collection of empty pot noodle containers discovered in certain rooms (notably Freya and Millie's! 😊). Our pétanque tournament was another highlight, with an impressively competitive spirit from all involved. Congratulations to our gold medallists Joe and Millie, silver medallists George D and myself (a proud moment!), and bronze medallists Arlo, Oakley and George K.

I would also like to thank parents for their patience following our late return (around 1am) and for the many kind messages received the next day, these were truly appreciated (particularly when some of us were functioning on very little sleep, followed by a late parents evening!). Finally, a huge thank you to my colleagues, Ms Bulbrook, Mr Lofts and Ms Aribi for their support throughout the trip. It was a pleasure to take such a fantastic group of students, and we all thoroughly enjoyed the experience.

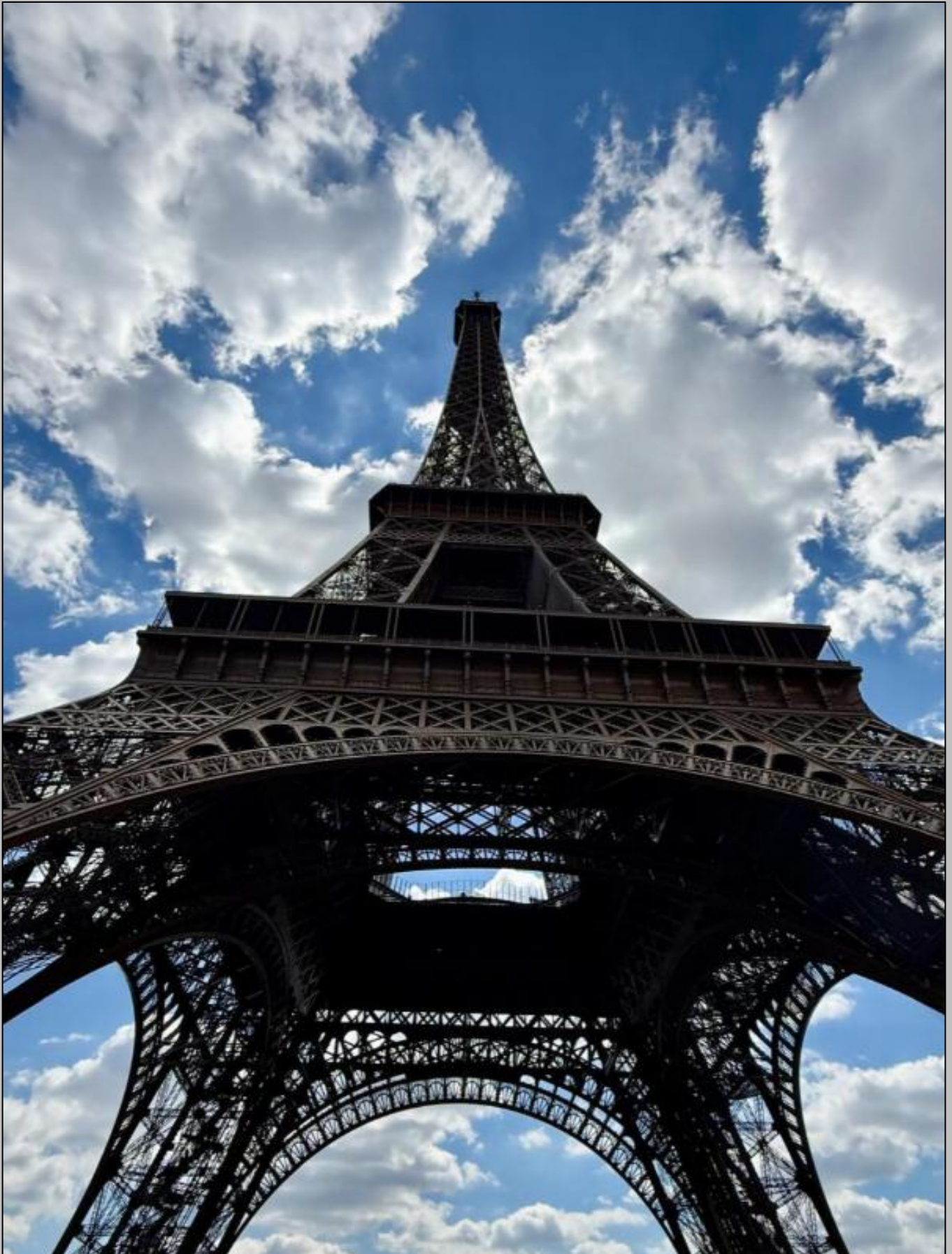

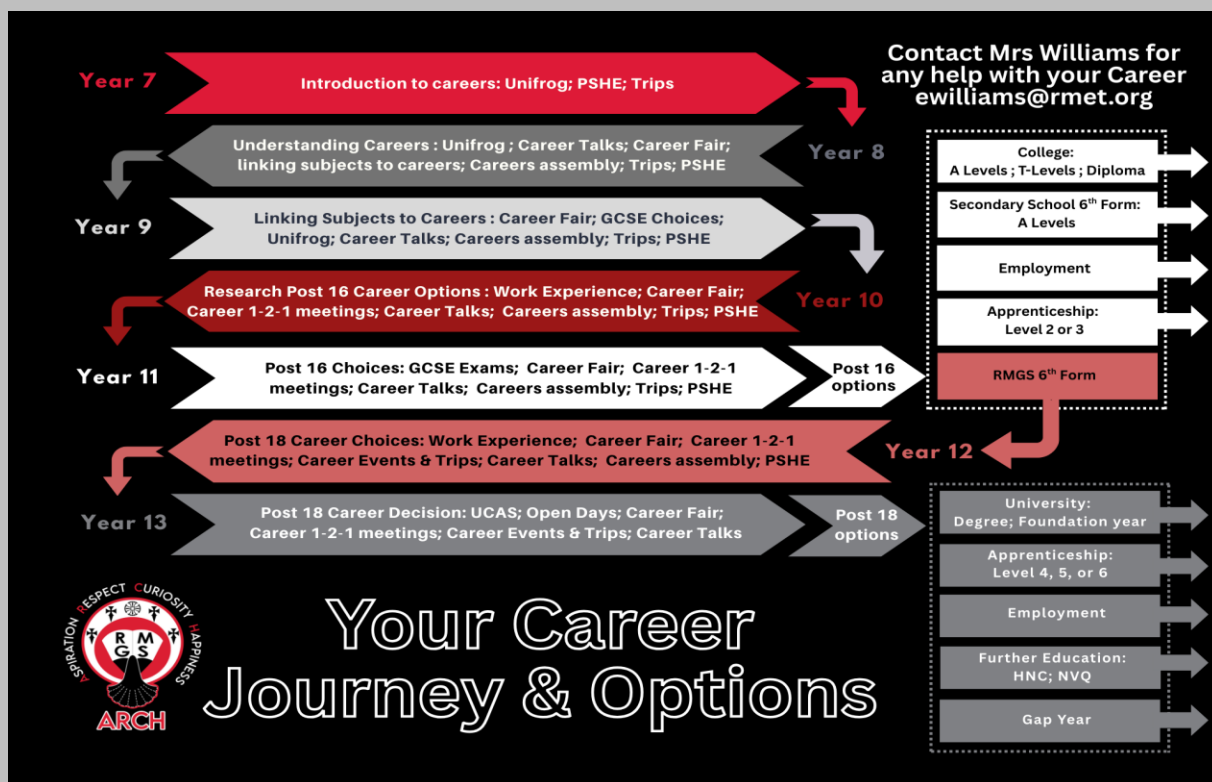

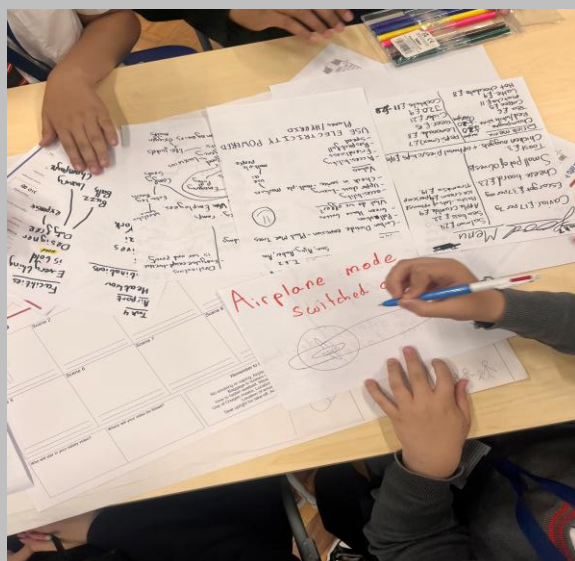
