## Headteacher's Message

As we reach the end of the first week of Term 6, I would like to thank our students and staff for such a positive start to the term.

This week has been KS3 Assessment Week, and it has been wonderful to see students preparing so diligently. During Breakfast Club, many students have been revising together and supporting one another in readiness for their assessments. It has been particularly pleasing to witness the collaboration, encouragement and mutual support that students have offered their peers. These moments reflect the strong sense of community that we are proud to foster at RMGS.

It has also been encouraging to see the excellent conduct and maturity demonstrated by our Year 11 and Year 13 students as they continue their examination season. I was fortunate enough to play a game of chess with Max D, in Year 11 before his exam on Monday. It was a breath of fresh air as Max patiently and enthusiastically explained a Magnus Carlsen move to me without judgement. I thoroughly enjoyed watching how Max and his friendship group use chess as a way to focus and prepare themselves before examinations. Their positive approach was inspiring and reflects the resilience and determination shown by many of our exam students. I have been particularly impressed by the positive, can-do attitude displayed across both year groups.

I would also like to extend my thanks to Mr O'Hanlon (Teacher of Geography), who has been leading additional planting around our school borders. This is a welcome addition to our site as we continue to promote the benefits that green spaces and planting can have on the wellbeing of our students and staff. The improvements are already making a positive difference to the environment around the school.

This week, I was also extremely impressed by Thomas W, in Year 10 who, alongside our Year 7 Technical Support team, delivered one of the most impressive presentations I have seen in a long time. 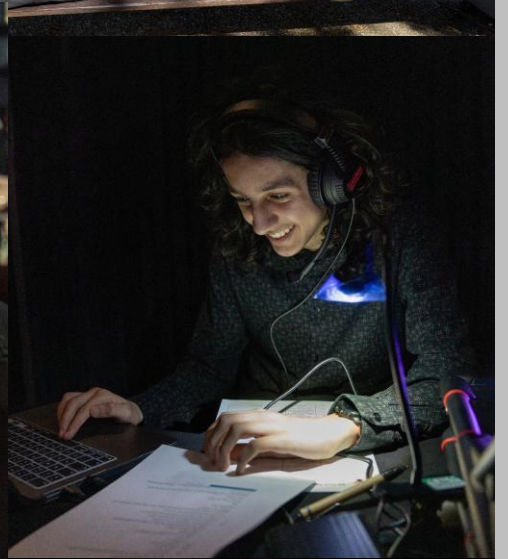

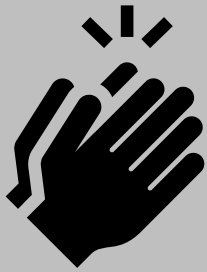

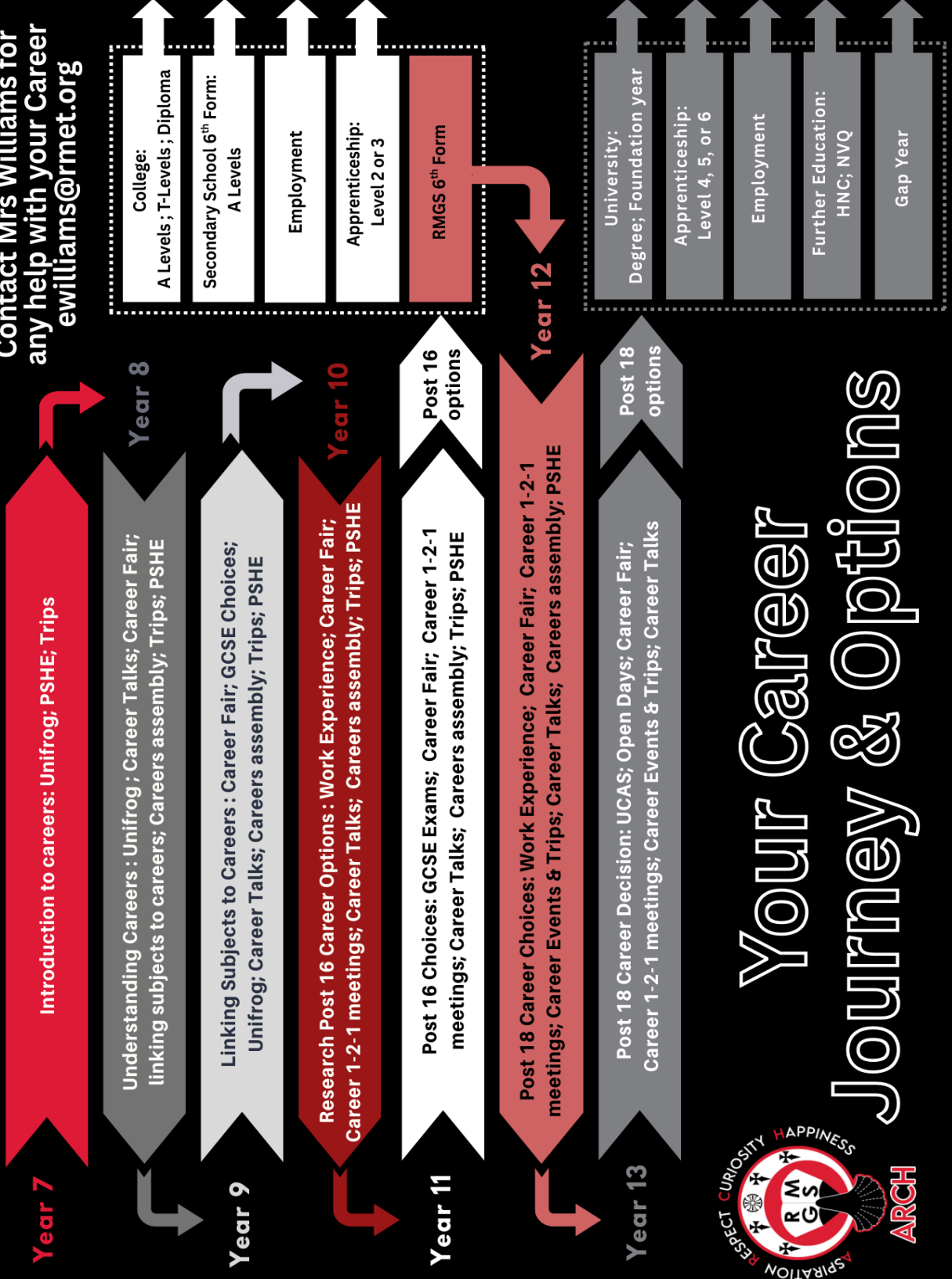

## Parents and Carers of Year 7 : Launching FSQ for Year 7 students

Next week Year 7 learners in will be completing the Future Skills Questionnaire (FSQ). The FSQ is a set of questions that have been specifically designed for young people in schools and colleges to help them to think about their skills, strengths and what they might like to do in the future.

FSQ is a key feature of our school's careers programme. We will analyse learner responses to help evaluate our careers provision, plan future careers activities and also identify learners who may need additional support.

The questionnaire takes approximately 15 minutes to complete, there are up to three sections of the questionnaire that cover the following areas: Careers knowledge and skills; Essential skills for life and work; Career Planning.

Completing FSQ should be an engaging and insightful activity for learners that will encourage them to continue thinking about their future choices and next steps after school or college. The Future Skills Questionnaire is completed online during one of the students Form Time sessions, through a digital product called Compass+

All learner data is processed in compliance with General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR). More information about how Compass+ collects, uses and stores personal data can be found here:
