Encourage teenagers to reflect on whether their friends:

- Respect their opinions, even when they disagree.
- Make them feel included and valued.
- Celebrate their successes rather than competing with them.

A useful question is: "How do you feel after spending time with this person?"

Discuss warning signs such as:

- Constant criticism
- Pressure to fit in
- Excluding others deliberately
- Controlling behaviour

Online, this might include:

- Demanding instant replies
- Pressuring someone to share photos
- Excluding people from group chats

Teenagers benefit from having:

- Close friends
- Casual friends
- Friends through hobbies and interests

Help them understand that they do not need a large friendship group to be socially successful.

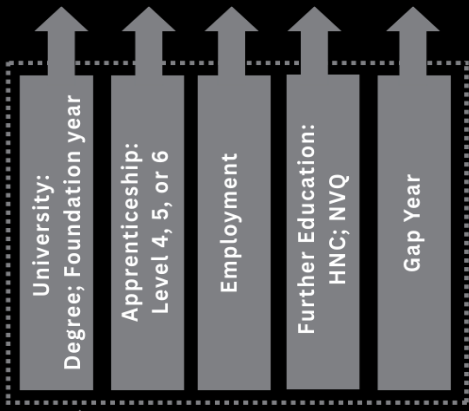
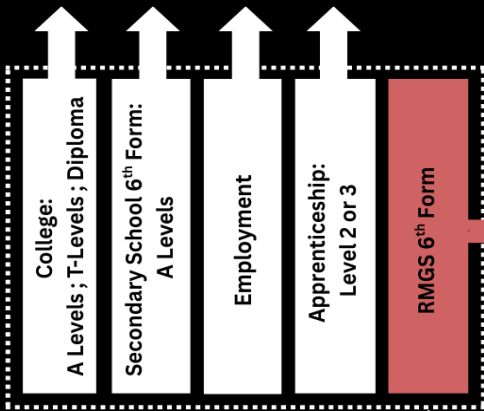

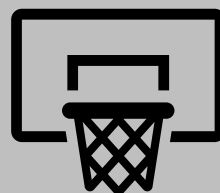
