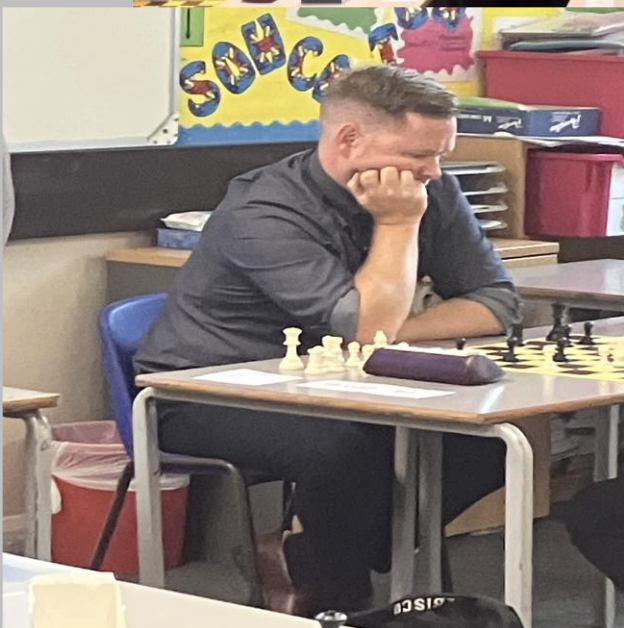
RMGS Chess Tournament Cup

🏆 Success in the Anthea Bell Translation Competition

We are delighted to celebrate the success of our students in this year's **Anthea Bell Translation Competition**, a prestigious national contest which encourages young linguists to develop their translation skills.

A special congratulations goes to **Elisabeth K (Year 12)**, who has been awarded a **Commendation** for her outstanding work. This is a fantastic achievement in a competition that attracts entries from students across the UK. We are also proud to recognise the participation of other talented linguists:

About the Competition

The competition is named after **Anthea Bell (1936–2018)**, a highly respected English literary translator. She translated works from **French, German, and Danish into English**, and is especially well-known for her translations of the *Asterix* comic series as well as major literary works such as **Franz Kafka's *The Castle***.

Anthea Bell received numerous awards for her work and was guided by a clear and powerful principle: a translation should read as though it were originally written in English.

In her honour, **The Queen's College, Oxford**, established this competition to inspire students and celebrate the art of translation.

Inspiring Young Linguists

The Anthea Bell Prize gives students aged **11 to 18** from across the UK the chance to translate texts in a wide range of languages, including:

- French
- German
- Italian
- Mandarin
- Russian
- Spanish

Taking part not only builds language skills but also deepens cultural understanding and creativity.

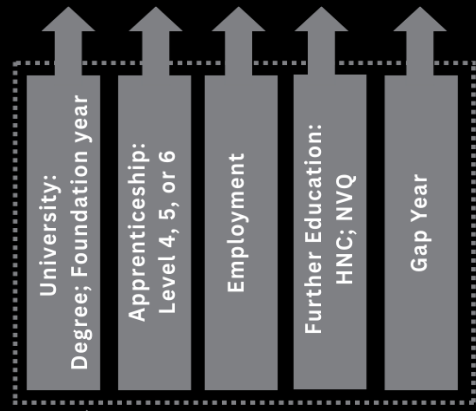
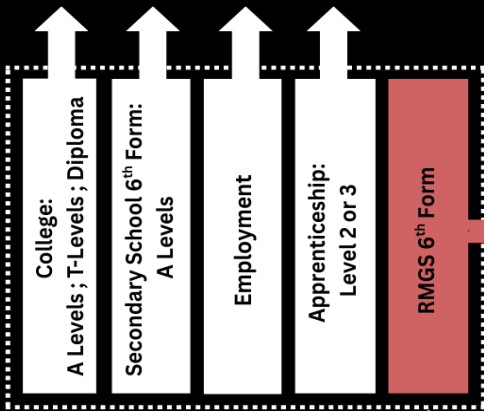

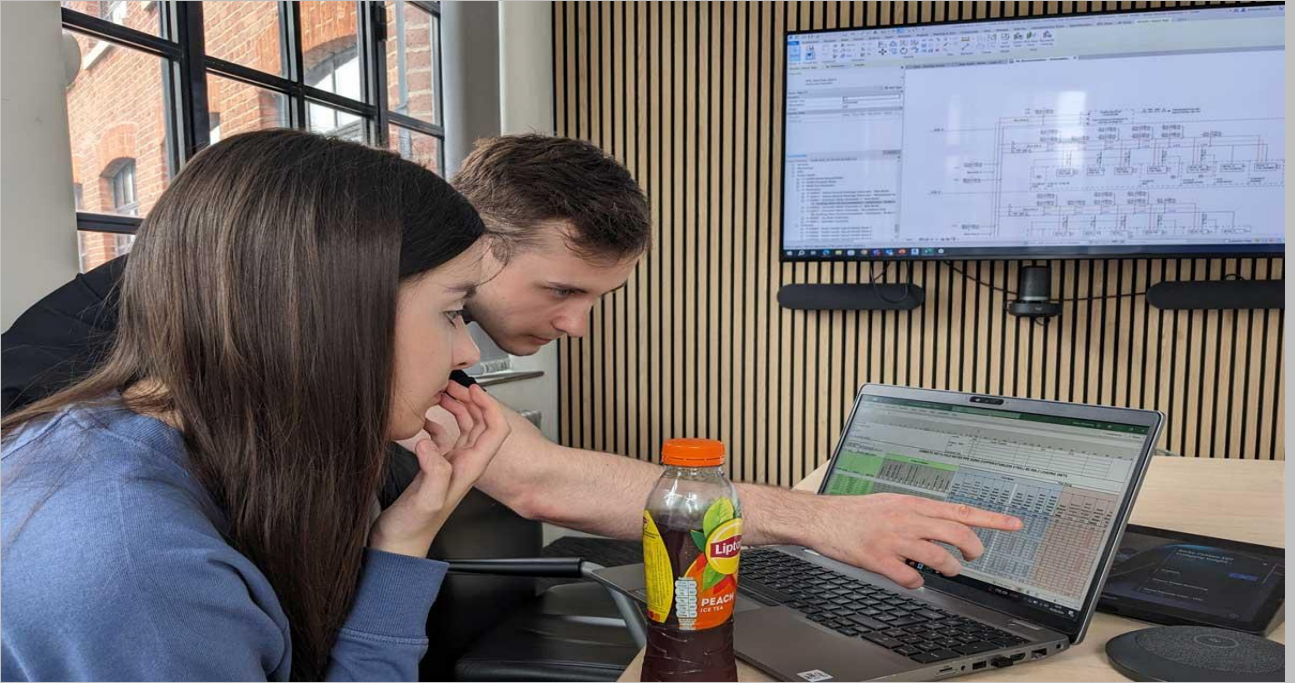

This is where we would love your help.

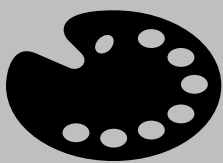
