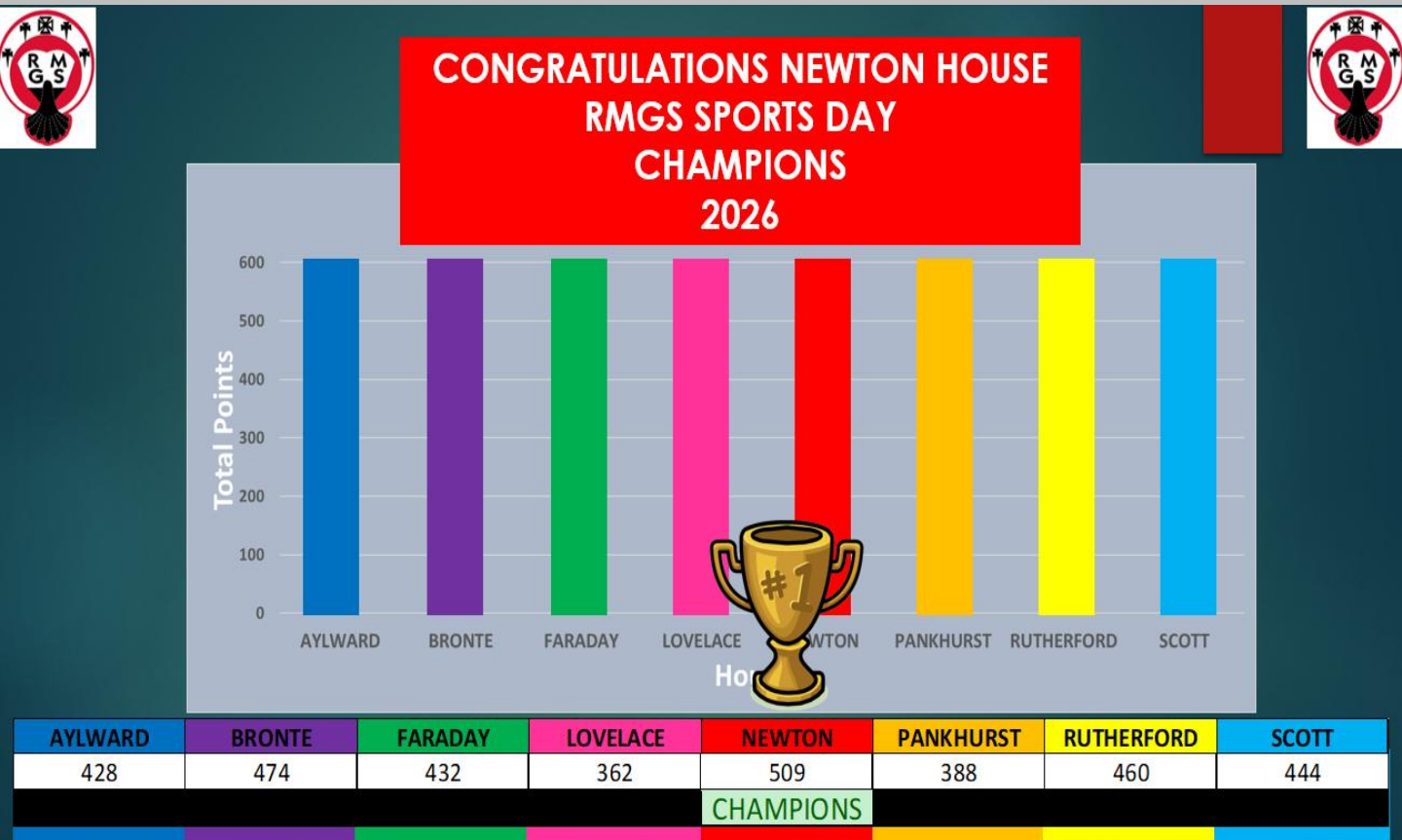

Our last full day was spent at the amazing theme park - Europapark. With rides such as Voltron, Blue Fire and the nostalgic Silver Star this proved to be an adrenaline-filled day for many. Our day ended with a meal at an impressive themed restaurant on site there.

We have had a great week - despite a few hiccups here and there, the students have been brilliantly behaved and have fully immersed themselves in the German culture.

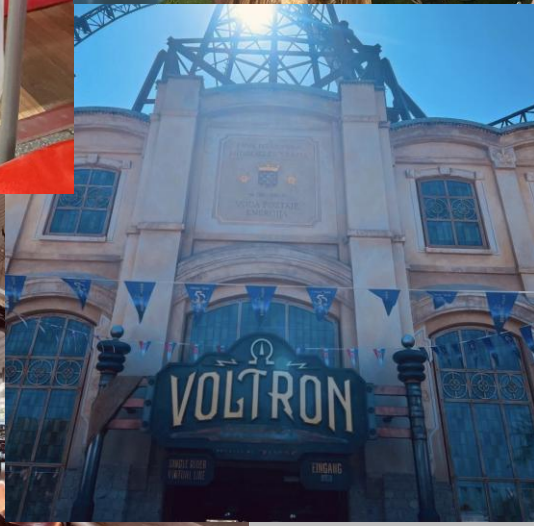

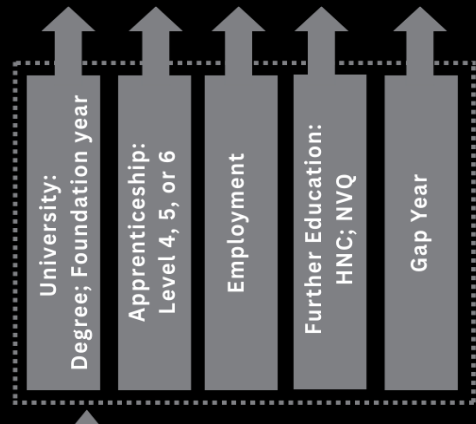
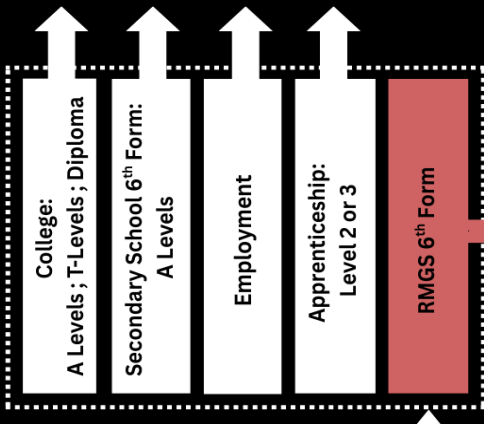

Getting your child prepared

Regardless of what year your child is going into in September – it is never too early (or late) for your child to start exploring their career pathways and options.

Raising Creative Aspirations for Year 12

On Tuesday the 7th of July the lead lecturer in Product Design and a lecturer from Architecture from University of the Creative Arts, Canterbury (UCA) met with our Year 12 Product Design students to inspire their NEA project and broaden their choices for post 18 studies. Stephen, who has worked very close with James Dyson over the years, spoke about his new venture of designing a practice rodeo bull for those who enjoy Western horse riding. He successfully wrote and obtained his own patent for the idea, which he has done previously on a few occasions with Dyson.

Also, the door stops we have installed around RMGS... he helped develop the design and was instrumental on improving it from it's previous iteration. Sonya, who owns her own Architecture firm with her partner, showcased a wide range of projects she has been involved in from housing development to theatre design. She spoke about how spaces should make us feel when we enter them and that every work day is unique, as a wide range of different clients all want something different.

Both spoke about the project work they undertake as UCA and what students can expect from their courses, including some final year work which have been entered into awards and showcases. It was an inspiring day and thank them both for attending where we hope to visit them in the near future to allow students to get feedback from industry professionals on their own coursework. A massive thank you to Mrs. Williams also for organising the day!

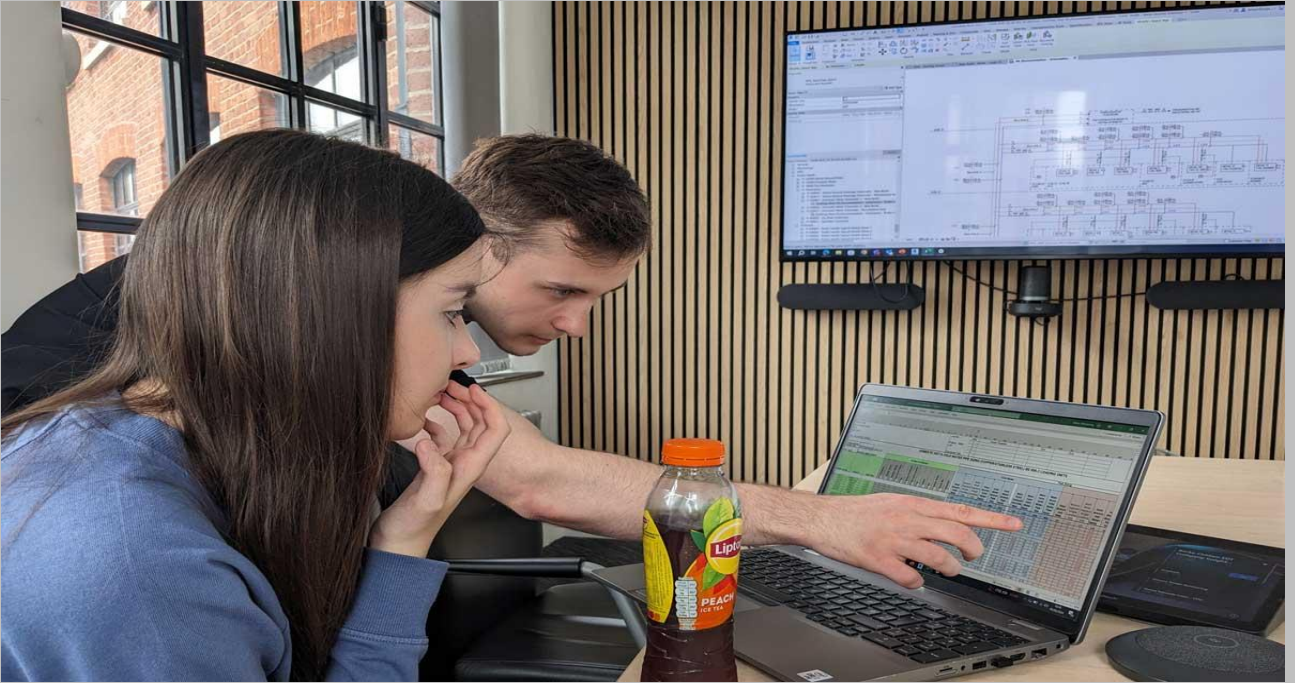
