Drawing from her AI Learning Experience Internship, Ka Yi introduced students to the exciting opportunities and challenges presented by artificial intelligence in education.

Topics included:

- ◆ Critical AI literacy
- ◆ Comparison of popular AI tools
- ◆ Benefits and limitations of AI tools
- ◆ Ethical and responsible AI use
- ◆ AI in higher education and future careers
- ◆ Using AI effectively in Geography studies, including prompt engineering writing and Gemini Notebook

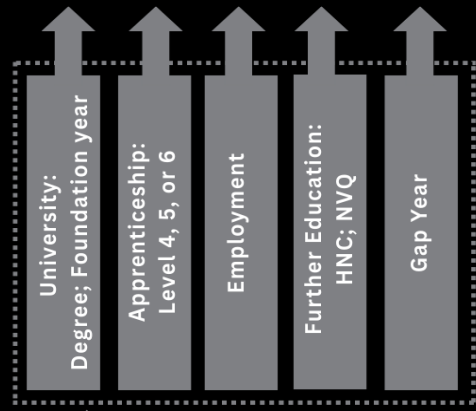
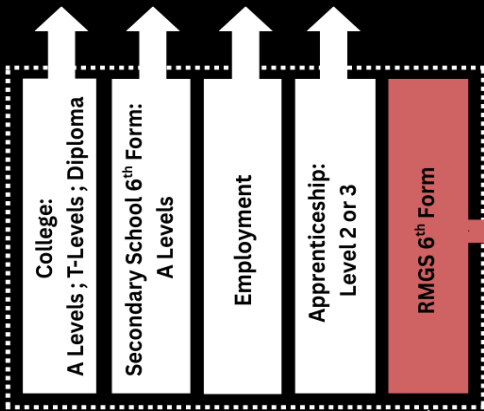
