<u>Janina Ramirez:</u> presented *Raiders of the Lost Past*, a series about three archaeological finds made in 1939 and *Handmade in Bolton*, in which she challenged Shaun Greenhalgh, a reformed convicted forger, to recreate artefacts of the past.

Andrew Graham-Dixon: Art historian and author. Expert on Caravaggio.

<u>Mary Beard:</u> Classics professor at the University of Cambridge. Interested in Classical Art and feminism. eg: 'Shock of the Nude.' 'Pompeii- Life and Death.'
