Lily A (year 13) entered the nationwide competition 'Reworking Manet' set by the prestigious Courtauld gallery.

Lily was one of the winners of the competition, having her work displayed in the gallery, having a Rembrandt removed from its frame, and replaced with her artwork, to facilitate this no less!

#### In Lily's words:

In May, I entered a nationwide competition set up by the Courtauld gallery in London to create a piece inspired by a well-known Manet painting 'A Bar at the Folies-Bergère' to be displayed as part of an exhibition in the gallery. Amazingly my piece - centred around feminist ideas and themes - was selected to be part of the online exhibition and in the in-person one, so last weekend I was invited to the opening of the exhibit with the other successful students.

I travelled up the Courtauld Gallery in London with my parents, to the opening of the 'Reworking Manet', an event which all the students chosen to exhibit were invited to, with their guests. The event started with speeches from the gallery's curators and members, before progressing to speeches from a couple of other students whose work was part of the exhibition. We first visited the painting the whole competition and exhibition was centred around, 'A Bar at the Folies-Bergère', which was so much better viewed in person than online. Here, we got the opportunity to explore the painting with multiple senses, as the gallery had worked with a perfumiest to recreate the smells of the painting, such as oranges and alcohol, the woman's perfume, the man's cologne and even the smell of the fabric used back then. The student exhibition itself was also amazing to see — not only was it incredible to see my own work up in a gallery, but also see to the range of interpretations others had created based on the brief. There was such a range of responses, from paintings and photography to sculptures and clay work and even some textiles. I also found out that they had removed a Rembrandt from its frame to put my painting in!

Afterwards, we had the opportunity to explore the rest of the gallery further, as it has some incredible collections, featuring artists such as Van Gogh, Rubens, Monet and Renoir. Due to being part of an exhibition, we also got special access to a new exhibition from Claudette Johnson called 'Presence', in which she explores depictions of black women and men in complex, stunning ways.

\*If you phone 999 but can't make a noise through fear of being found, it will go to the Police Voice Response System. You will then hear a recorded message which tells you that you are through to the Police and to press 55 if you need an emergency service. The message lasts 20 seconds and if the caller presses 55, the operator will know it's a genuine emergency. If 55 is not pressed, the 999 operator will MOT be notified.
