The Hero Project

Year 12 students welcomed guest speakers from the charity Anthony Nolan on 15th December, to deliver an education programme entitled 'The Hero Project'.

Anthony Nolan saves and improves the lives of people with blood cancer by matching them with remarkable donors willing to give blood stem cells for potentially life-saving transplants.

The Hero Project works in collaboration with NHS Blood and Transplant to deliver presentations to 16 to 18 year olds about stem cell, blood and organ donation.

The presentation is aimed to dispel common myths, explain the importance of donation for sick patients and arm students with the facts about what is involved. Enabling them to make an informed decision about becoming a donor in future.

RMGS Eco initiatives and projects

As we start 2024 I would like to remind parents and students about some exciting eco initiatives and projects happening at RMGS this year, and take the opportunity to encourage all members of our school community to get involved! Small changes add up, so please have a read and see what you could do to support these student-led initiatives.

- 1. The canteen loyalty card- every time students bring their own thermos or ask for a mug (instead of a single-use cup) they receive a stamp. When 6 stamps have been obtained they get their 7th drink free! This has recently been extended to include the 'Bring a Box Bargain' in which students can bring their own Tupperware boxes for hot food and dessert (instead of buying a takeaway box for 60p) receiving a stamp each time to go towards their free hot drink. Want a way to cut costs and unnecessary waste? Get your canteen loyalty card today!
- 2. Plastic bottle greenhouse- the Eco Club are collecting plastic bottles to build their very own greenhouse for our school garden. Start saving your bottles today, and students can drop these off by the main hall in the big blue box. We will need several hundred!
- 3. Uniform Bank- we are no longer taking donations for the Uniform Bank, as this term we will be trialling new ways to make the scheme more efficient. This may change, so please stay posted! Students who wish to get involved can drop by the backstage room on Tuesday and Thursday form times after registering with their form tutor.
- 4. Litter Critter Crew- runs three times a week: Monday, Wednesday, Friday form times. Students meet in the quad after registering in form (runs during form time).
- 5. Eco Club- runs Tuesday lunchtimes in D3
