

- We are currently running a new trial scheme for the Uniform Bank, as an alternative to the previous order form. There is now a rail of uniform available for students to browse in a quiet corner of the school library, with a range of sizes and items available. Students will be able to access the rail at break and lunch, with volunteers replenishing the stock so that there's always plenty of uniform available. As before, all items are completely free with no obligations attached. Please encourage students to see what we've got, and make the greener choice today!
- Please continue to donate your clean plastic bottles for our plastic bottle greenhouse project, students can drop these off in the blue box by the top-up point by the main hall.
- The shortage of loyalty cards has now been sorted, and there are plenty now available from the hot food hatch! Are you a parent or carer who wants to talk to your child about mental health?

This Children's Mental Health Week we want all children and young people, whoever they are, and wherever they are in the world, to be able to say – and believe - "My Voice Matters".

We visited primary and secondary schools to ask students what they wanted from the week – to help shape the activities we create for schools, the messaging we give to teachers, the tips we give to other children, and the advice we give to parents, carers and families.

Here's what children and young people told us they need from you:

- We don't need to have 'one-off conversations about our mental health'

 sometimes a chat on a journey or at bedtime is enough.
- I need to know it's okay to talk to you about any and all of my feelings. Please hear what I have to say, without interrupting me.
- Please listen to me carefully and acknowledge how I am feeling – it might seem silly to you but what I am going through is important to me.
- Playing with pets can make me feel better.
 Same with playing football, basketball or
 whatever type of sport I am into.
- Don't compare my experiences to your own when you were a child.
- Sometimes I just need you to listen and hear what I'm saying – I don't always need answers (or lectures)
- Please don't worry about trying to fix things for me I often just need to know you are there for me and understand what I am going through.



If you are open with me about your feelings, this can help me to be more open about mine.



Sometimes I don't want to talk. Please trust that I will come to you (or another grown-up or someone my own age) when I'm ready. Sometimes it's easier for me to talk to someone nearer my own age – my siblings, cousins, friends, younger teachers at school - because they 'get it'.



Sometimes a hug is all it takes to make me feel supported.




