Both teams demonstrated great teamwork, skill, and sportsmanship - we couldn't be prouder! 🏂 Well done, everyone!























### I FAYE:


Shakespeare schools was a fun experience that brought me closer to multiple people and was an exciting experience to participate in and I would 100% do it again.


