#### **Symposium**

There were 9 schools at this heat with two students from their school, who would have already won the opportunity to represent their school and there would be 5 winners selected by the judges to go through to the overall final. The schools at this heat were: Chatham Grammar School for Girls, Dartford Grammar School, Dartford Grammar School for Girls, Fort Pitt Grammar School, Gravesend Grammar School, Mayfield Grammar School, Wilmington Grammar School for Boys, Wilmington Grammar School for Boys and of course our school Rainham Mark Grammar School.

The range of topics covered in the speeches were varied such as; the corrupting influence of money, poverty, the importance of arts and even the importance of napping! (let's not forget that they are teenagers-napping is vital!) I loved listening to the speeches throughout the day and experienced a range of emotions: at times I was moved by the passion that these young people were displaying about things that they obviously care so much about, I was informed about a number of unique and interesting topics, I was entertained by the subject matter and performances and I was inspired by some thought-provoking ideas.




