World Book Day

Dear Parents and Guardians,

We will be celebrating World Book Day at RMGS on Thursday 5th March, and we are encouraging all students and staff to dress up. The only rule is that costumes should be related to a piece of literature (novel, poem, play, manga etc.). Other than that, feel free to get creative! For example, instead of dressing up as a character, you could go as the title of a book. If you choose not to dress up, you must wear school uniform as usual.

We will be offering rewards for the best costumes on the day. This will be in four categories: best individual costume, most creative costume, best group costume and largest group costume (see how many of your friends you can get involved!). Runners up will be rewarded too, and form tutors will be encouraged to give out R points to celebrate as many people as possible.

The purpose of this is to celebrate reading, something we strive to promote at RMGS, as reading regularly is not only valuable for students' creativity and mental wellbeing, but also has significant academic benefits. Alongside the costumes, there will be other activities related to reading and writing going on throughout the week.

I'd also like to highlight another reading initiative that we have launched recently : **'Get Caught Reading'**. This has been created and launched by our literacy and academic prefects to encourage a culture of reading around the school. Bookmarks have been given out to all students in Years 7 -11, so if a teacher sees a student reading outside of lessons, they can acknowledge it by signing their bookmark. If a student gets caught 5 times, they'll receive an R4 and be entered into a draw for further (reading -related) prizes.

For the last few years World Book Day has been a great showcase of the enthusiasm for reading staff and students have at the school, and I hope that this one will continue that tradition.

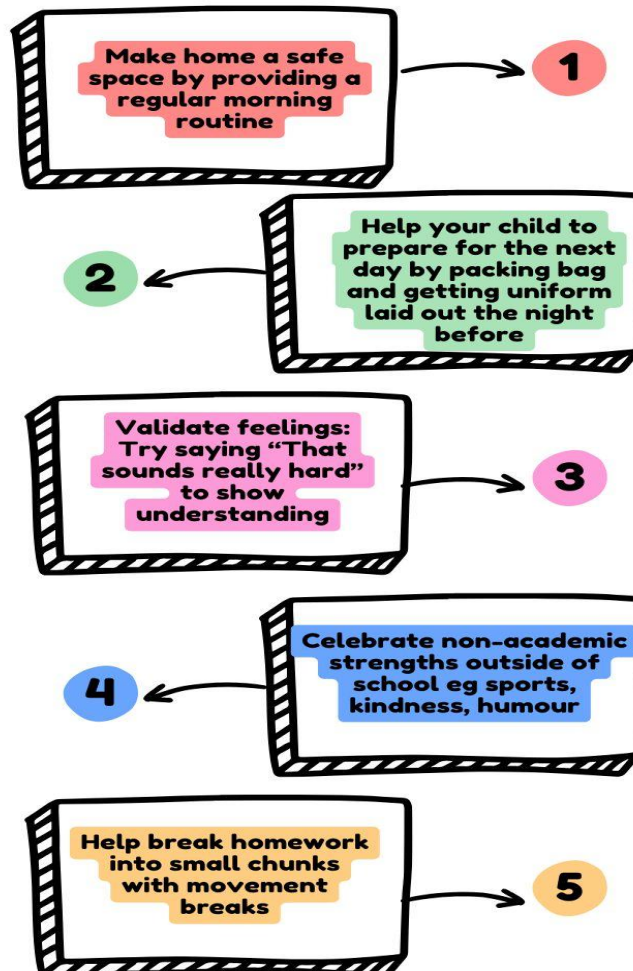

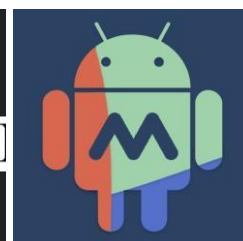

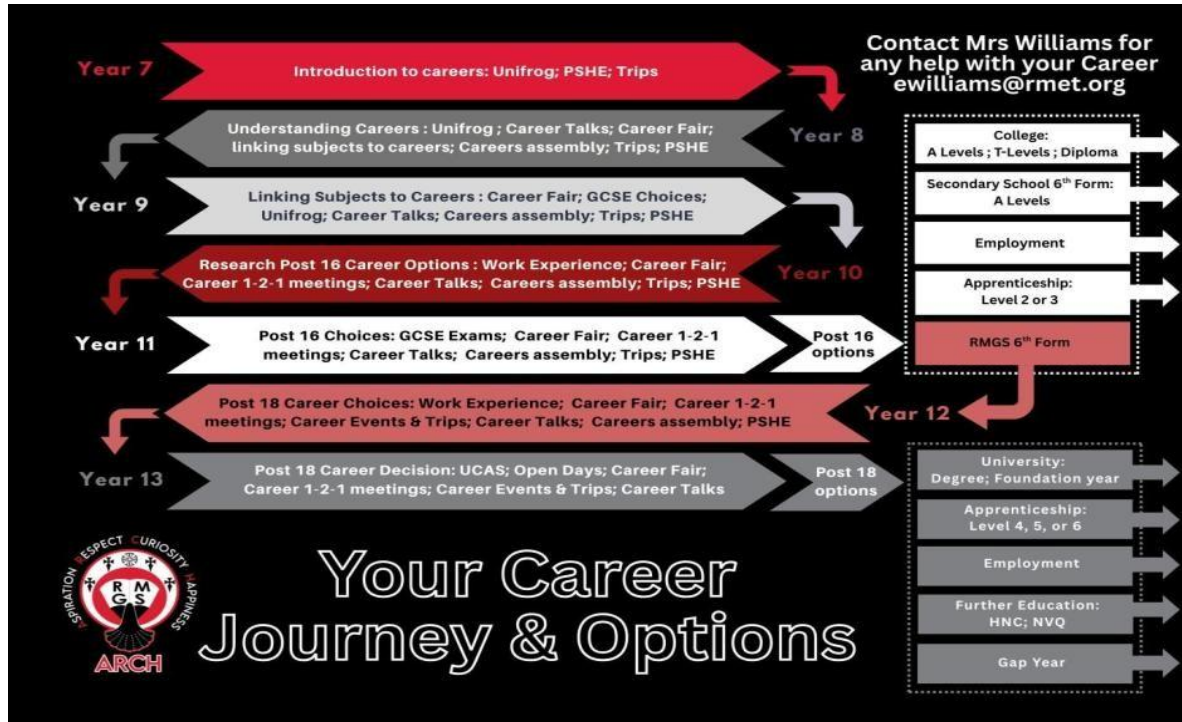
